

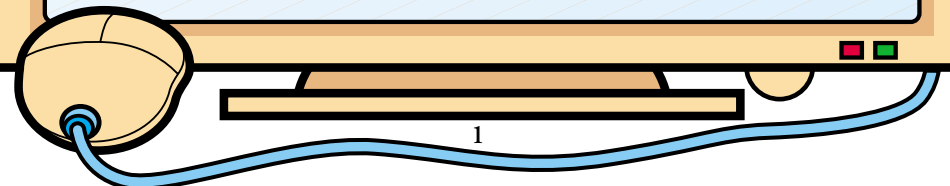
Read the following verses. Answer each question according to the Scripture given.

Family E-mail Encouragement List

1. Bring the family together and hand out index cards.
2. Talk together about people in your family, church, or neighborhood who need to be encouraged.
3. Write their names, addresses, phone numbers, and e-mail addresses (if known) on cards and place in a special box or folder.
4. Each night, get together and pray for the names on the cards.
5. Once a week, send a handwritten and family-decorated card to each name.
6. If you have access to e-mail, add these names to your e-mail address book and send these people cards and messages at other times to let them know you care.
7. Ask your family to think of additional ideas for communicating with and encouraging others.
